## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This conference will provide an update on the latest treatment modalities for end stage organ failure. The conference will focus on recent advances in the management of heart, liver, lung, and kidney failure, and on new developments in the care of diabetes. As more and more patients suffer from diseases such as cardiac failure, liver cirrhosis, pulmonary hypertension, diabetes and obesity, clinicians must be armed with the knowledge of how to care for patients with advanced organ failure. The conference will investigate current therapies such as multi-organ transplantation, ventricular assist devices, and treatment of hepatocellular carcinoma, islet transplantation, and innovative treatment options for patients with more advanced organ failure. Attendees will also explore the criteria for transplantation and the great importance of timing of referrals.

## TARGET AUDIENCE

This continuing medical education activity is designed for family practice physicians, cardiologists, hepatologists, gastroenterologists, oncologists, pulmonologists, nephrologists, internists, pathologists, nurses, social workers, and allied health professionals with an interest in transplant.

## EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this activity, the participant should be able to:

- Analyze the potential for successful medical therapy for heart failure based on patient presentation
- · Discuss patient selection for assist devices for bridge to transplant and destination therapies
- Review strategies for treatment of Hepatitis C and the long term potential for achieving minimal viral counts.
- Discuss etiologies of pulmonary failure and updates regarding management of disease specific treatment considerations, including cystic fibrosis.
- Identify current clinical and research therapies for diabetes.
- Discuss cellular therapy and recent pancreatic transplant outcomes.
- Deliberate and discuss ethics surrounding organ transplantation of patients who are considered high risk.
